

# PRO Checklist of deliverables to impress your client

The base that saves you hours and sorts your next delivery.

# The Checklist (printable with boxes)

Usage note: Mark what you've already completed and highlight pending items. Includes a micro-reference diagram (layout).

## 1) 3D Model (SketchUp) — Essential Bonus

- [ ] Clean .skp file with well nested components and groups.
- [ ] Layer/label structure by discipline (architecture, carpentry, lighting, furniture, artifacts).
- [ ] Correct axes and units (mm or cm) + defined tolerances.
- [ ] Scenes for: 3D floor plan, ISO elevations, carpentry details.
- [ ] Library: standardized materials and optimized textures.
- [ ] Logical naming in Outliner (furniture, doors, baseboards, lighting).

**Tech Tip:** Prepare scenes with crisp styles to export directly to Layout without rescaling.

## 2) Layout — The language of the builder

- [ ] Plan with complete dimensions (general + detail) and axes.
- [ ] Elevations for each front with heights, levels and references.
- [ ] Carpentry details (min. 2), joints and key hardware.
- [ ] Table of finishes by room.
- [ ] Scales and plotting ready (A3/A2 if applicable) + bleeds and label.
- [ ] Cross-review of floor plan ↔ elevations (consistency of dimensions/thicknesses).

**Tech Tip:** Use scrapbooks/templates in Layout for consistent labels, tags, and dimensions.

## 3) Renders (D5 Render) — Clarity that sells

- [ ] 2 key views per space (general + functional detail).
- [ ] Lighting: balance between natural and inset (avoid burnt/reflections).
- [ ] Materiality: actual scales and normal/roughness maps where applicable.
- [ ] Camera: height ~1.40–1.50 m, straight vertical lines.
- [ ] Export in high (3000–4000 px) and light web version.

**Tech Tip:** Save one Render Preset per project to maintain consistency between revisions.

## 4) Moodboard (Canva) — Change-proof concept

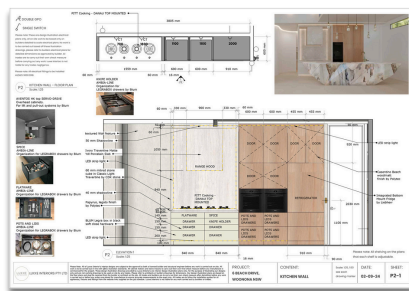
- [ ] Strong idea (1 sentence) + palette with codes.
- [ ] Textures and finishes with supplier reference when possible.
- [ ] Key pieces (3–5) that define the language of space.
- [ ] Atmosphere / use / maintenance notes.
- [ ] Presentation version and thumbnail for folder cover.

**Technical tip:** Order from left to right: concept → materials → parts → application.

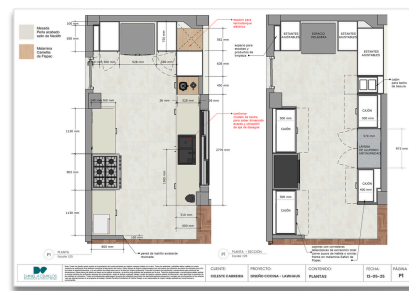
## 5) FF&E — Buy without surprises

- [ ] Sheet with code per item (001, 002, etc.).
- [ ] Technical description + dimensions + finishes.
- [ ] Supplier / link / quote and estimated lead time.
- [ ] Thumbnail image per product.

**Tech Tip:** Use basic validations (yes/no, in stock) to speed up customer decisions.
